WARM UP LANE BREAKDOWN

Competition pool

- Lane 0 –> para swimmers
- Lane 9 -> pace lane from starting end during all warm-up
- Lane 1& 8 -> sprint lane one way swimming
 - starting at 8:00 AM / 5:00 PM
 - Lane 1 & 8 from start end

in lane 1.





Backstroke ledge will be available during the last 45 minutes of the warm-up

WARM UP/COOL DOWN LANES

3 LC lanes in the Warm up pool will be available. Please note that there will be different lanes assigned to the athletes. Check with pool staff each day.

COMPETITION MANAGEMENT (1)

- All starts for all events are from the West end (dive tank end).
- Dive over starts for Prelims / Pool will be cleared for each event/heat in Finals.
- Distance Events: 800 & 1500
 - fastest heat swims during finals.
 - Alternating gender 800/1500 from fastest to slowest for slower heats in **Prelims**
 - Lap Counters available for teams to use. (Teams to provide counter.)
- Relay Events:
 - fastest heat swims during finals (except for Mixed Medley Relay on Sunday where ALL heats will be in finals)
 - Slower heats will swim time finals, slowest to fastest, running the full event during prelims. We will not alternate gender.









COMPETITION MANAGEMENT (2)

- Swim-offs run by the end of the session which the tie occurred
- Finals sequence: B > A > B > A.
- Awards to be presented during swimming. Please refer to timeline provided in heat sheets.
- Individual 400m events
 - swimming slowest to fastest,
 - circle seeding the fastest 2 heats.
- Communication / updates will be via documents in your folders at clerk desk.
- Scrolling Results TBD



MEET SCORING

- Individual events, places 1 20:
 - A final: 50-30-20-19-18-17-16-15-14-13
 - B final:12-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1
- Relays events, places 1 10:
 - A final: 100-60-40-38-36-34-32-30-28-26
- Para events will not be scored.
- Foreign swimmers are not eligible to score points.



WARM-UPS

SWIMMING CANADA WARM-UP COMPETITION PROCEDURES dated September 26, 2016 are in effect.

Violations:

- Swimmers may be removed from their first event Second offense in same competition: removal from competition

Permitted:

kick boards, pull buoys, snorkels (in competition pool)

Not permitted:

- fins, paddles, stretch cords in competition pool No Diving in competition pool except in Sprint Lanes during Sprint / Dive Starts in designated timeframes.



HEAT SHEETS & RESULTS

Prelims and Final Sheets:

- Available daily from the Clerk of Course.
- Posted on the web as soon as they are ready and prior to each session. Foreign swimmer designation – A finals & B finals (max 2 only).
- Foreign swimmer alternate max 1 alternate for finals to replace foreign swimmer no show only.

Results:

- Posted after each event on the pool deck and upstairs. Posted after each event on the Swimming Canada website.



SCRATCH PROCEDURE

- Deadlines
 - meeting
 - Fri-Sun Prelims & Time Final events: 30 minutes following the start of finals the previous evening
 - Finals: 30 minutes following Prelims events (excluding time final events)
- Penalties for no show (heats and finals) = \$50 (as per SNC 3.4)
- Email scratches NOT accepted following start of Tech Meeting.





Thursday Prelims & Time Final events: 30 minutes after Tech

FINALS - READY ROOM PROCEDURES

- Positive check in at the clerk of course during warm-ups for finals.
- 3 rows of heats available in Ready Room.
- Swimmers (all "A" & "B" finalists) report to ready room 15 minutes before scheduled start of their race.
- "B" finalists will not be marched on, should be ready behind the blocks when the "A" Finalists are in the water, and they will be introduced once their race is started - during their race.
- "A" finalists will be marched on once the first "B" finalist finishes the "B" final race. Music will play and there will be no introductions while marching on. "A" finalists will be introduced during the "A" final race.



BACKSTROKE DEVICES

- The IT or Field of Play will install the device and ensure the device is set at 0, initially.
- The IT will check the strapping is free of any twists or knots and that the ledge is sitting flat against the wall.
- Once the athletes arrive behind the block the athlete may change the setting and ensure it is secured into position or may remove it from the water if they do not wish to use the device. The IT may be asked for assistance.
- A general warning may be given for toes not on touchpad





RELAY PROCEDURE / SUBMISSION

Clerk will have Relay Forms/Cards for Coaches at start of the session each day. Coaches will return completed Relay Forms/Cards even if there are no changes from initial entries by the scratch deadline so that they may be seeded.

FOREIGN ATHLETES

Olympic program events

 A maximum of two (2) foreign swimmers and or relays will be to advance to a "B" Final. Foreign swimmers will swim Exhibition during finals.

Paralympic program events

A Final as long as they have an International Sport Class. (TBC)



permitted to advance to an "A" Final OR seeded top 10 in a timed final event. A maximum of two (2) foreign swimmers will be permitted

No limit on the number of foreign swimmers that can advance to the

PARA-SWIMMING

Finalist will be determined using the British Points System.

- British 2015 Para Points Scoring (implemented in Hy-Tek MM). up to 10 swimmers will be permitted to swim
- 3 Para Swimmers per Class limit
- Others will be added to fill lanes to 10 and will swim as exhibition. Seeding in Finals is by time for Para events
- Any approved Para tapping devices, backstroke start aids etc. need to be approved prior to the session by the Technical Advisor. See the TA prior to each session. Any taping for para – explicitly, to be reviewed by TA.



DQ'S AND PROTESTS

- **Disqualifications:**






FACILITY LAYOUT(1)
