CANADIAN OPEN WATER SWIMMING TRIALS

Swimming Canada hosted a very successful inaugural Canadian Open Water Swimming Trials in the Cayman Islands on April 27, 2019. Swimming Canada partnered with the Cayman Island Swimming Association to host the 10km event and officials from both Canada and the Caymans participated. TIMING MALFUNCTIONS

Officials may have seen recent reporting/news regarding timing malfunctions at high-profile international events, most recently during the British Swimming Championships in Glasgow. These malfunctions are easily avoided and can be caught by meet managers, electronics operators and starters. Most commonly these errors are caused by misconfiguration of the Normally Open (N.O.)/Normally Closed (N.C) setting between the starting unit and the timing console.

Almost every timing system has a configurable setting on the starting and timing console. The starting system and timing console must match in order to get accurate results. As an example see the Daktronics start below. The user manuals for Quantum, Daktronics and Colorado are an important resource and a proper understanding of the system is needed by meet managers, electronics operators, and starters.

The equipment check, which may also include a watch check, prior to the session can serve multipurposes and should catch this starter/console mismatch error. This could be observed through a delay in the clock starting or a polarization error message on the electronics console. Starters should also ensure they know how to read the battery indicator on the starting equipment and notice which port a cable is plugged into. In cases where the equipment is owned by the facility, or when contracted equipment providers are on site, officials may be asked not to adjust any of the equipment themselves but bring any equipment issues to the attention of the appropriate contact and/or meet management.

2018 Canadian Para-Swimming Point Calculator

The 2018 Canadian Para-Swimming Point Calculator is now available on the Swimming Canada website, found <u>here</u>, as well as loaded into Hy-Tek (version 7Fc) and in Splash. This point calculator is only for Paralympics events, which are:

50 Free	S1 to S14	50 Breast	SB1 to SB3
100 Free	S1 to S14	100 Breast	SB4 to SB14
200 Free	S1 to S5 and S14	50 Butterfly	S2 to S7
400 Free	S6 to S13	100 Butterfly	S8 to S14
50 Back	S1 to S5	150IM	SM1 to SM4
100 Back	S1, S2 and S6 to S14	200 IM	SM5 to SM14

Swimming Canada encourages provincial programming to include the Paralympic events, with the integration of para-swimmers in non-Paralympic events, where the swimmers compete for time and not for points.

New para swimmers' report available when entries are submitted

There is a new para swimmers' report available for Meet Manager's, where the para-swimmer's classification as well as their codes of exception are available when entries are submitted via the Swimming Canada Meet List on-line entries system. In order to access this report, you need to select view entries for the associate meet and then click on the para classification report to view the list of all para swimmers registered to your meet with their respective sport classes (classification) as well as their codes of exception.



2019 WPS World Championship - new site announced

The 2019 World Para Swimming Championships will take place in London, Great Britain from September 9 to 15, 2019. This decision follows the International Paralympic Committee (IPC) decision earlier this year to strip Malaysia of the right to host the event as the Malaysian government failed to provide the IPC with the necessary guarantees that Israeli Para swimmers could participate, free from discrimination and safely in the Championships. The change in location resulted in the cancellation of the Swimming Canada Can-Am meet in Vancouver. Para-swimmers will have the opportunity to compete at the fully integrated Canadian Swimming Championships in Winnipeg in early August.
