CANADIAN OLYMPIC AND PARALYMPIC SWIMMING TRIALS

From an officiating perspective, we will also be adapting to the announced format. As a qualifying event for the Olympics and Paralympics, FINA and WPS referees and starters must be used. When considering the other officials' positions on deck, recruitment will focus on Ontario officials, to limit travel from across the country.

Officials wishing to work at a national event will be encouraged to consider officiating at the 2021 Canadian Junior and Senior Swimming Championships July 26 to August 2, held in Calgary, Alberta.

OCRC WORKING GROUP

Return to Competition and Officials Development in year of Covid-19: Over the past six months this working group first looked at creating Best Practices and Recommendations for Officials in returning to competition. This document was shared with the provincial sections to adapt to the individual realities found across the country. Currently underway is the creation of another Best Practices and Recommendations document to help support the provinces in officials' development during the 2020/21 season. Focus of this document will center around officials' clinics, deck sign-offs for certification, referee assessments, referee evaluations and general suggestions to keep officials engaged and motivated through this very different season.
