WARM-UPS

SWIMMING CANADA WARM-UP COMPETITION PROCEDURES dated August 3, 2020 are in effect.

Violations:

- Swimmers may be removed from their first event
- Second offense in same competition: removal from remainder of the competition

Equipment Permitted:

kick boards, pull buoys, snorkels (in competition pool)

Equipment Not permitted:

- fins, paddles, stretch cords in competition pool
- No diving in competition pool except in Sprint Lanes during Sprint / Dive Starts in designated timeframes.


- **Paraswimming Lane:** Dedicated Lane 1 in Competition Pool during warm ups

- NOTE: Lane 6 may also be used as an additional Sprint/Dive lane upon approval

- Starts for 100m and longer events are from the Dive Tank (North) end except for Event 323/324 150IM which will start from the Change Room (South) end.
- 50M EVENTS WILL START FROM THE CHANGE ROOM (SOUTH) END OF THE POOL
- The CCES will be conducting Doping Control during the meet. All 18&U athletes must be accompanied by a team representative.

Preliminary Sessions

- Dive over starts for Prelims except for backstroke events, the start and finish of Para events and 50m events.
- Preliminary heats will be swum senior seeded with top 3 heats circle seeded except for 400 m events where top 2 heats will be circle seeded.
- No circle seeding in Paralympic preliminary events.
- Swim-offs run by the end of the preliminary session which the tie occurred.





Finals Sessions

- Pool will be cleared for each event/heat in Finals.
- There will A and B finals in individual events, per age group (youth and senior)
- Finals sequence: A > B.
- Awards to be presented during swimming of the B finals. Please refer to timeline provided in heat sheets.





Time Final Events

800 & 1500

- Fastest heat regardless of age swims during finals.
- Alternating gender 800/1500 from fastest to slowest for slower heats in prelims
- Lap Counters will be used
- There will be **NO positive check in** for distance events:
 - Thursday 800/1500: scratch deadline is 30 minutes after Technical meeting
 - Sunday 800/1500: scratch deadline is 30 minutes following the start of Saturday finals





Time Final Events (con't)

Relays

- Top 8 relay teams will swim in finals except for Mixed Medley Relay where all teams will swim during Sunday finals.
- The remaining relay teams will swim in prelims slowest to fastest without alternating gender.

Official Splits

 Requests for official splits must be submitted to the Admin Desk on appropriate forms at least 30 minutes prior to the session.





RELAY PROCEDURE / SUBMISSION

- Thursday Relay cards will be available from the clerk and any changes will be accepted until 30 minutes after the Technical Meeting.
- Friday, Saturday and Sunday Relay cards will be available at the Admin desk and considered entered as submitted with entry file unless coaches make changes prior to the scratch deadline for Time Finals.
- **Relay names changes** will be accepted up to 30 minutes prior to the start of the session in which they are swum.

SCRATCH PROCEDURE

- Deadlines
 - > Thursday Prelims & Time Final events: 30 minutes after Tech meeting > Fri-Sun Prelims & Time Final events: 30 minutes following the start of
 - previous evening's finals
 - > Finals: 30 minutes following Prelims events (excluding time final events)
 - Email scratches NOT accepted following start of Tech Meeting and a meet scratch (online form) are required. https://form.jotform.com/230334529211244



PENALTIES

- \$50 for any no shows, late scratches, step-downs, or unexcused incomplete swims during prelims or finals.
- For Prelims: fine must be paid during or by the end of the session.
- For Finals: fine must be paid immediately. Swimmer shall not swim subsequent events (in any session) until the penalty has been paid.
- An invoice from Swimming Canada for late scratches, no shows, step-If coaches prefer to have the invoice sent to a different contact, please update Becky. That invoice is due on receipt and can be paid via credit card on deck.

- Finals sequence: A > B
- A, B finalists and alternates are to report to the ready room 15 minutes before the scheduled start of their race.
- B finalists will be released from the ready room for their event and should be ready behind the blocks. They will be introduced during their race
- A finalists will be marched on once the B finalists finish the B final race. Music will play and there will be introductions while marching on.







FOREIGN ATHLETES

OLYMPIC and PARALYMPIC PROGRAM EVENTS

- to advance to an "A" Final OR seeded top 8 in a timed final event.
- named where applicable and will only be moved into finals with the scratch of another foreign swimmer.
- Foreign swimmers will swim Exhibition during finals.



A maximum of two (2) foreign swimmers and/or relays will be permitted

 A maximum of two (2) foreign swimmers will be permitted to advance to a "B" Final. A maximum of one (1) foreign alternate for B finals will be

PARALYMPIC PROGRAM

- Finalists will be determined using the 2021 Canadian Paralympic Points System. Maximum 3 Para Swimmers per Sport Class advance to Finals.
- Seeding in Finals is by time for Para events
- Paralympic Program Warm-up:
 - Lane 1 in competition pool during warm period
 - Lane 2 in WU pool during the competition.
- Any approved Para tapping devices, backstroke start aids etc. need to be approved prior to the competition by the Technical Advisor. This may be done after the Technical Meeting. Any taping for para – explicitly, to be reviewed by TA prior to each session.



DQ'S AND PROTESTS

Disqualifications:

Procedure for protests:

- Discuss DQ with the session Referee
- (protest forms will be available at the Admin Desk).
- If not resolved after discussion of the written protest, the matter may be assigned to a Jury of Appeal. There is no fee for the protest or jury.



Disqualifications will be announced and include event number, heat number

If not resolved, a written protest may be presented to the Referee. A written protest must be presented within 30 minutes after the conclusion of the event

JURY OF APPEAL



 CGR 9.3.1.2 The Jury of Appeal shall be chaired by the National Meet Director at National Competitions. The chairperson shall have no vote. The voting members shall be odd in number preferably either three (3) or five (5), and should be the most experienced Swimming Canada/PS officials or officers available, in addition to the requirement to include a coach, as determined by the CSCA after the entry deadline. None of those participating on the Jury of Appeal can have been involved in the disputed decision or disqualification. In the event that there is no coach available, the jury will still convene, and the outcome shall be final.

 CSCA provides 2-3 coaches in advance of each meet who are willing to sit on a jury of appeal if required. These coaches should show geographic diversity.



MEET SCORING

- Individual events, place
 - A final: 30-25-20-15 5-4-3-2-1
- Relays events, places 1 8:
 - A final: 100-60-40-34-32-30-28-26



Foreign swimmers are not eligible to score points.

AWARDS

- Medals for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place
- Team Championship Banner
- Male and Female High Point Aggregate by age group (Olympic Program). Male and Female High Point Aggregate (Paralympic Program) Medal for Foreign Swimmers placing in top 3.

- Note: If a swimmer is unable to attend their award ceremony, please send a fully uniformed substitute swimmer in their place. Foreign swimmers will receive their medal on the same podium as the Canadian medalists.







GENERAL FACILITY INFORMATION

FACILITY LAYOUT







ACCREDITATION INFORMATION

- Accreditation will be required to gain access to the pool deck
- Access to the pool deck is through the Competition gate through the west turnstile between the spectator seating areas (see map).
