Non-compliance with these procedures will result in the removal of the swimmer from his/her first event of the session.

Access to the pool deck will be restricted to swimmers, certified registered coaches, and session officials.

• EVERY SWIMMER MUST take a rinsing shower on deck before entering the water.

OFFICIALS and EQUIPMENT

Number of officials for the event

TOTAL Number of Officials: Maximum of 36

EQUIPMENT: Fully automatic; pads on finish ends; one plunger at start end; Chief Timer will be provided with 2 watches.

- 1 Meet Manager
- 1 Referee
- 1 Starter
- 2 Electronics (1 Chief Judge Electronics (can double as Meet Manager), 1 Chief Finish Judge)
- 2 Chief Timers (positioned 1 near lane 1 and 1 near lane 8)
- 2 Judges of Stroke (positioned on each side of the pool at the false start rope; walk the length of the race for each stroke except freestyle)
- 8 Turn Judges (positioned at start end); using plunger for each turn and at end (in order to judge turn)
- 8 Turn Judges (positioned at turn end);
- 8 timers (positioned at start end)
- 2 Clerks (1 positioned on heat entry side and 1 on end-of-race pool exit side)
- 1 Chief of Officials (may double as relief official where/when necessary; present at official check-in for placement and contract tracing)
- 1 Assistant Chief of Officials (may double as Turn Judge; necessary to aid in sanitizing of pencils, clipboards, and any other equipment as necessary)

OFFICIALS PROCEDURES

- 1. Officials are encouraged to sign up in advance to ensure enough available to run the session.
- 2. Upon entry, sign-in with Chief of Officials is required to confirm placement.
- 3. Officials proceed to Crocodile Cove to remove and store outdoor footwear (indoor footwear is mandatory).
- 4. Officials are required to bring their own water and to dispose of any single use bottles at the end of the session. NO HOSPITALITY WILL BE PROVIDED
- 5. Officials will be provided with sanitized pencils, clipboards, and any other equipment which must be returned to Chief of Officials at the end of the session at the cleaning table
- 6. Referee uses own or provided electronic whistle (sanitized).
