Para swimming relays are incredibly strategic and exciting events. More than just selecting the fastest swimmers, para swimming relays teams are built around classification points where the classification number represents a point. In this way, a S4SB5 swimmer, for example, brings a 4-Point count to any Freestyle, Butterfly, or Backstroke relay leg (S4), or a 5-Point count to any breaststroke relay leg (SB5). Similarly, a VI (S11, S12, S13) or II swimmer (S14) will always bring 11, 12, 13 , or 14 Points to a relay team. The key is to build the fastest team without going over the point limit.

## The Races

There are four different point groups which races can be built around based on stroke (Freestyle or Medley), distance ( 50 m or 100 m ), and gender (Male, Female, Mixed. Mixed relays require equal gender representation).

20 POINT: Four swimmers whose combined classification number does not exceed 20. S14s and VIs are not eligible.

34 PDINT: Four swimmers whose combined classification number does not exceed 34. S14s and VIs are not eligible.

VI RELAY: Four VI swimmers, one of whom must be classed S11.

S14 RELAY: Four II/ S14 swimmers.
